This territory is located approximately 60 km west by water from the small community of Hudson's Hope. The lake is your main source of transportation, although there is a great airstrip adjacent to the camp.

Having the lake, and no other roads to the camp, really gives the outfitter an opportunity to cash in on several different activities. Let's take a look.

First and foremost, of course, is the outfitting business. What could be better than to have a camp in a great location completely outfitted; walk in and everything's there, oh maybe don't forget to bring the horses in.

As mentioned, this is pretty isolated, so the horses generally come in by landing craft. That's right, on the lake, it's really a super way to spend the day. Although, it is possible to trail them into the lodge as well, it just takes a bit more time.

Once you're at the camp, there's trails and more trails, old logging roads to utilize (only accessed via water), and lots of access to high country where you have spectacular views and many

mountain species. This has been a very productive area for many, many years.

Let's talk Stone Sheep. Stone sheep over the past few years has risen in value considerably. Certainly, the top dollar today is in the neighborhood of \$125,000 US.

You have an opportunity to take successful hunters; this outfitter has been taking 1-2 sheep hunters a year and running 100% success since 2019. That's a pretty good number for a single species!

Sure, that's a great hunt, but that's not all, you also have excellent moose, elk, and goat. I'm sure you are aware that all these animals have increased in value and now make for a very lucrative business.

Using either horse, trucks (there have been a few barged in) or ATV/UTV you have great access to much of the area.

The area is large with good outpost camps, certainly lots of places to hunt, expand and explore. Other species that round out your season include black bear, wolf, and of course, deer. Certainly, there is a very productive spring black bear season, with no shortage of bears or locations to hunt.

But wait, if you really want to capitalize on this spectacular location and camp, there's also the summer trade. Use those horses in the summer for trail rides, pack trips or overnight hiking expeditions with clients from around the world. There's plenty of high country to show off the spectacular scenes that British Columbia is so well known for.



Obviously using some of the boats and equipment to get around you can also access some great fishing locations. The fishing market is increasing once again; the equipment and the fish are here to grow the business in that direction.

On top of this, currently, the owner has a solid group of returning cabin renters from fishermen, corporate groups, family groups, to geologists and more. For a family coming from the big city this is a trip of a lifetime. Do it all, see it all, and enjoy it all.

Don't bypass this opportunity, it gives you time at camp during the summer to prepare for your fall season. As of right now, the business has very good adventure tourism revenue, without tapping into the fishing market, which leaves a new owner an opportunity to increase this revenue even further.

Oh well, of course you need a camp! This camp is nice; not only is it in a fantastic spot overlooking the lake, but it also has good infrastructure that has been well taken care of. You can see the attention to detail and the love that has gone into it. It has a good airstrip, access from the lake, but also a very established, well thought out building scheme.

There are several guest cabins along with the lodge overlooking the lake. Of course, there are also many outbuildings for the various tasks at hand, including fresh greens from the significant greenhouse and a lakeside sauna!

Now of course, to run one of these great outfits you need equipment and stock. This outfit comes with 25 horses, several boats, trucks and ATV/UTV's. The list is extensive, and I won't get

into all of the nuts and bolts, but everything you need to operate is here.

As a bonus, the outfitter, who has been there for many years, is willing to stay on and show you around. This is, without a doubt, an advantageous addition to any purchase. At their own choosing, this outfit has been underutilized which provides the new owner the opportunity and potential for growth.

If you're looking for an outfit that has it all, game, adventure tourism, equipment, fabulous camp, and just walk in, well, then you found it. There's not many like this, especially in a location that allows for boat access (convenient and cost effective) where you can get away from other hunters and tourists.

AREA DATA:

Williston Lake Outfitters is nestled in the spectacular Rocky Mountain foothills of northeastern British Columbia.

The territory encompasses a diverse landscape featuring rugged mountains, alpine meadows, dense forests, and the pristine waters of Williston Lake – creating a perfect habitat for abundant wildlife and offering unlimited recreational opportunities.

Williston Lake

Williston Lake, created by the W.A.C. Bennett Dam, is British Columbia's largest reservoir with a surface area of approximately 1,761 square kilometers. This massive body of water offers exceptional fishing and boating opportunities, with minimal competition due to its remote nature.

The lake is home to Bull Trout, Lake Trout, Rainbow Trout, Kokanee, and Mountain Whitefish, providing excellent sport fishing potential.

The Peace Reach arm of Williston Lake, where the outfitting territory is located, is characterized by its stunning fjord-like setting - with mountains rising directly from the water's edge. This dramatic landscape creates a truly awe-inspiring



backdrop for all activities based from the main lodge.

Wildlife Abundance

The territory is renowned for its healthy populations of big game species. Stone Sheep, among North America's most prized big game animals, thrive in the alpine regions of the territory.

Mountain goats inhabit the higher elevations, while moose, elk, and deer populate the valleys and forest edges. Black bears are abundant throughout the territory, with spring and fall hunting opportunities. Predators including wolves and coyotes round out the diverse wildlife population.

The varied terrain – from alpine meadows to riparian zones along the lake – creates perfect habitat for this diverse wildlife population. The territory's isolation from major population centers helps maintain these healthy wildlife numbers and ensures a truly wilderness hunting experience.

Hudson's Hope Area

The nearest community to the property is Hudson's Hope, a historic settlement with a rich past dating back to 1805 when Simon Fraser established a fur-trading outpost in the area. Today, this small community of approximately 1,000 residents serves as the gateway to the Peace River region and offers basic amenities including grocery stores, accommodation, and fuel services.

Hudson's Hope is accessible via Highway 29, connecting to larger centers such as Fort St. John (90 km east) and Chetwynd (66 km south). The Peace River Regional District, where Hudson's Hope is located, has experienced steady economic growth driven by natural resource industries including forestry, mining, and hydroelectric power.

ECONOMIC GROWTH & POTENTIAL:

Premium Hunting Market Growth

The market for high-end guided hunting experiences has shown remarkable resilience and growth over the past decade.

CLIMATE:

The Williston Lake region in northeastern British Columbia's Rocky Mountain foothills experiences a northern continental climate characterized by four distinct seasons, each offering unique recreational and operational opportunities.

The following information is specific to the Hudson's Hope/Peace River region where Williston Lake Outfitters is located.

Winter (November-March)

Winters in the northeastern BC Rocky Mountain region are cold and snowy, with average temperatures ranging from -10°C to -20°C (14°F to -4°F).

Snowfall is substantial, creating excellent conditions for winter activities and providing vital habitat for wildlife.

The lake typically freezes by late November, enabling winter access by snowmobile. The coldest temperatures usually occur in January, occasionally dropping below -30°C (-22°F).

Despite the cold temperatures, the region experiences many clear, sunny days during winter, creating spectacular conditions for winter photography and recreation.

Spring (April-May)

Spring arrives gradually, with temperatures warming to daily highs of 5° C to 15° C (41° F to 59° F).

This is a period of transition in the territory, with melting snow feeding numerous streams and creating optimal conditions for spring bear hunting.



The ice on Williston Lake typically breaks up in late April to early May, coinciding with the start of the spring operating season.

Spring brings vibrant wildflower blooms to the alpine meadows and increased wildlife activity as animals emerge from winter hibernation or return from migration.

Summer (June-August)

Summers are pleasantly warm with average daytime temperatures ranging from 18°C to 25°C (64°F to 77°F).

The region's northern latitude creates extended daylight hours, with **nearly 17 hours of daylight** at the summer solstice in June. This extended daylight maximizes opportunities for outdoor activities.

Summer precipitation is moderate, often coming as afternoon thunderstorms that quickly clear. The combination of warm temperatures and long days makes summer ideal for fishing, hiking, horseback riding, and water-based activities.

Fall (September-October)

Autumn brings cooler temperatures ranging from 0°C to 15°C (32°F to 59°F) and spectacular foliage as the aspens and poplars turn golden.

This is prime hunting season, with clear, crisp days and cool nights creating perfect conditions for hunting expeditions. The first snowfall typically arrives in late October, gradually transitioning the landscape toward winter conditions. Fall weather patterns are generally stable, providing reliable conditions for scheduled hunting trips.

Climate Advantages for Operations

The territory's climate pattern creates natural operational seasons:

- **Spring:** Bear hunting and early season fishing (May June)
- **Summer:** Adventure tourism, horseback expeditions, fishing (June August)
- **Fall:** Prime hunting season for all species (September October)

This marked the beginning of the fur trade era in the region, with the North West Company and later the Hudson's Bay Company operating trading posts.

The area became an important portage point around the impassable Peace River Canyon, making it a strategic location for fur traders traveling between Fort Chipewyan and Fort McLeod.

Resource Development and Modern History
